



## *A Spirit of Cooperation*

The Eastern Shore Chamber of Commerce Governmental Affairs Committee held a special "Spirit of Cooperation Town Hall Meeting" on Thursday, August 20 at 5:30 pm at Daphne Civic Center. Over 500 citizens of Daphne, Fairhope and Spanish Fort attended the meeting. The event was moderated by Rob McElroy, of Daphne Utilities, who serves as chairman of the Governmental Affairs Committee.

The primary purpose was to announce that the three cities have united in a spirit of cooperation in efforts to secure state, federal, and other funding sources, especially in regards to environmental and transportation/infrastructure concerns. The belief is that with many voices we can reach a wider audience if spoken as one. Earlier in the month all three cities signed a joint proclamation pledging to unite for support of shared issues.

The Daphne/Spanish Fort Choral Group opened the event with a performance of the national anthem. The Daphne/Spanish Fort ROTC Color Guard presented the colors, with Dr. Barry Booth, who spearheads the Honor Flight Program for WWII Veterans, leading attendees with the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

Darrellyn Bender, president/CEO of the Chamber presented the keynote speech explaining cohesiveness of the

Eastern Shore. She said the Chamber's efforts are to help grow businesses, create good jobs, insure an excellent quality of life and promote tourism. She said there are over 75,000 people living on the Eastern Shore. By uniting with one voice, we are stronger.

"Our cities are combining efforts with the support of the business community to save money and man power, becoming more efficient," said Bender "This builds on the foundation of Blueprint for Tomorrow."

David Ed Bishop, commissioner of Baldwin County congratulated the three cities for their united effort. He provided examples shared efforts throughout the county, such as flood plans, funds acquired for bus stops, road construction improvements underway and plans for the future and proposed construction.

Bishop introduced representatives of Team Green, which has been contracted to re-develop Magnolia Landfill as a 65 percent recycling facility, which will be first of its kind in the nation. The facility is expected to cost \$7 - \$10 million.

State Representative Randy Davis told the crowd that the state legislature spent most of the session working on the budgets

and coastal insurance issues. He said much of the Stimulus Funds have been allocated, however, most of it was moved to the next fiscal year.

Davis provided a list of road construction updates, including widening of Highway 31 through Spanish Fort to a four-lane road. He said the widening of Highway 181 will be under contract by the end of the month. Davis told the group that a storm water management plan for the D'Olive Bay Watershed, which includes about 10 different tributaries, will be designed by Thompson Engineering.

"Alabama brings home the bacon," was the comment Chuck Spurlock made, who is the state director for U. S. Senator Jeff Sessions. He explained that the congressional delegation for Alabama works closely together in a bipartisan method to help get direct federal appropriations and grants. Because of the numerous stimulus packages available, competition is great, and those

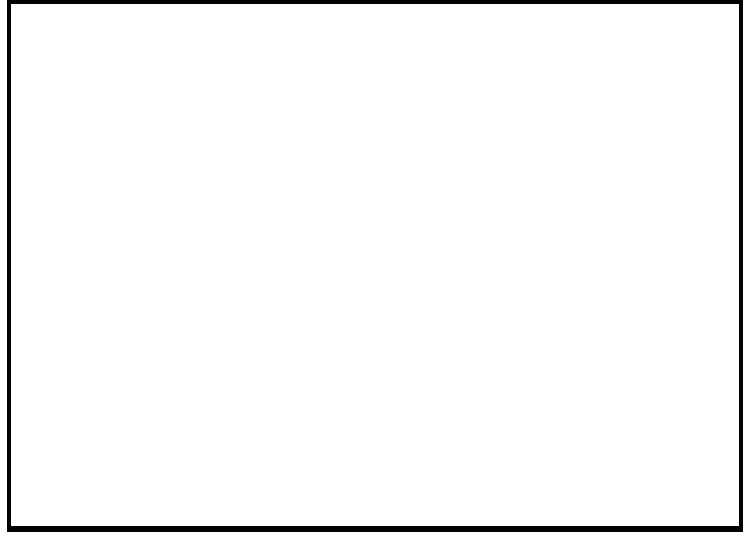

appropriating the funds look for cost effectiveness. Therefore, by uniting in one regional effort, the possibility of being awarded grants for shared issues increases. Only 13 percent of the stimulus dollars have been spent thus far.

"The bay doesn't stop at city lines and neither does BRATS," said Congressman Jo Bonner. He said bonding together and not divided will make the Eastern Shore strong and create prosperity for all. Foley, Gulf Shores and Orange Beach's "GUMBO" PAC was one example he gave that proved unity can create positive actions for the betterment of the whole community.

The final agenda item was the official reading of the "Spirit of Cooperation" proclamation.
